Year 11 students are expected to:

Participate in the offer detailed in this booklet, which is unique to Five Acres High School.

Attend school 96% of the time or above and attend Period 6.

Revise thoroughly for exams, using flash cards and other effective revision strategies.

Actively participate in lessons with impeccable behaviour, keeping AP referrals to a minimum, so their teachers know what they understand and what they need help with.

Come to school fully equipped so that they're ready to learn.

Students who participate fully in this offer will be rewarded for doing so as detailed in this booklet.

Students who do not participate fully in this offer will be removed and will not receive the extra support detailed in this booklet.

Have goals - we will be asking Year 11 to set these, to know what their own personal success looks like and how to achieve it.

Be committed and dedicated to achieving their best, demonstrating determination even when things don't go to plan or when they're tired.

Be resilient - to take on feedback, act on it with the sole aim of getting that little bit better, every day.

Show kindness towards themselves and others - we're ultimately a team and teams only thrive when everyone is going in the same direction, supporting each other to get there.







At Five Acres High School, we firmly believe that all students benefit from outstanding school attendance because this has a direct impact on students achieving both academic and personal success.

We expect that all students will:

Attend school regularly.

Attend school punctually.

Attend school appropriately prepared for the school day.

We expect that all our parents/carers who have day to day responsibility for our young people to:

Encourage regular school attendance.

Ensure that the child/children in their care arrive at school punctually, prepared for the day.

Contact the school before 8.30 am to let us know of a child's absence.







Period 6 is as an extra, mandatory lesson for Year 11. This approach is not about extending school hours; it's about optimising the learning experience and making every minute count towards academic success

Key things to know about Period 6:

It is 1 hour of timetabled, relevant revision with subject specialists every day, 3pm-4pm.

It starts on the first day back in September.

Period 6 is designed to remove barriers to revision, offering a structured and disruption free environment that mirrors the structure of all their other lessons.

100% attendance is expected from all Year 11 students.

The extra lesson equates to 170 hours of additional revision across the year.

Students may need an alternative way of getting home after Period 6, especially if they have previously taken a bus.

Homework becomes revision



In year 11, homework becomes revision. English, Maths and Science will continue to use Sparks and Seneca. Option subjects may use the above or set their revision through booklets and/or Quizlet

Our Homework is Revision strategy is:

Set by subject specialists. We will require Year 11s to revise topics that have previously been taught to support their retrieval of knowledge and application of skills.

Research-led and proven to improve academic outcomes. (We are in the top 3% in the country for progress, two years running.)

Proven to promote positive study habits.

Mandatory - 100% completion is expected from all Year 11s.

Supported through 'Working Lunch' - a space to complete this revision so that it doesn't have to be done at home.







In year 11, Tutor Groups are Intervention Groups during which, students will receive additional teaching in either English, Maths or Science.

Intervention groups are:

Determined by PPE results. Students are put in the Intervention Group best suited to their attainment so that they receive expert teaching that significantly enhances their academic achievement in that area.

Likely to change throughout the year, depending on PPE results. Although, some students do stay with the same tutor all year.

Led by our Heads and Seconds in charge of Subjects.

An additional 40 minutes of focused instruction in these core subjects each day. This increase in contact time with expert teachers can make a substantial difference in students' understanding, retention, and application of key subjects.







We also ensure that we reward students extensively for their hard work so there is a programme of treats to ensure they're recognised and celebrated for demonstrating the habits and characteristics of Champions.

The Exit Timetable A programme of revision sessions is offered during February, Easter and May Half terms. Revision sessions offer a structured and disruption free environment with subject experts.

A session with their teacher before an exam. They will offer last minute tips and advice to support students' success.

A targeted intervention designed to support students on the evening or Period 3 of their exam.

This starts in April and is a weekly timetable that details the exams, boosters, warm-ups and additional revision sessions they should attend that week.
